- Coleraine, south-west Victoria
- 685mm rainfall, winter dominant
- 1800ha | 1500ha grazing
- 50% Merino sheep, 50% cattle
- Average long-term stocking rate of 20DSE/ha
- Benchmarking in the SWFMP for over 30 years
- No irrigation or underground water

Enterprise

- Choice not too important.
- Keep it simple and specialise in one or two.
- Can the product be contracted of forward sold?
- Flock/herd structure.
- Can it be easily be altered for seasonal conditions?








On-farm productivity

- Having a good pasture base
- Match the feed supply and demand
- Good infrastructure
 - o yards
 - o laneways
 - o fencing








Benchmarking

- Know your cost of production
- Compare it against your peers
- DSE per labour unit
- Product produced per 100mm of rainfall
- Net profit/ha/100mm
- Net profit/DSE



Top three take-home messages

- 1. Know your cost of production/benchmarking.
- 2. Match your enterprise to your seasons.
- 3. Have some surge and relief capacity.
